PROCLAMATION  
BY THE  
GOVERNOR

TO THE PEOPLE OF KANSAS, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, professional public service requires a wide range of skills--managerial, political, and legal--to implement policies and programs and to provide government services; and

WHEREAS, public employees gain those skills through experience and by pursuing advanced degrees in public administration and maintain those skills by being actively involved in professional associations; and

WHEREAS, public administrators serve citizens as city administrators, police officers, social workers, health care professionals, contract specialists, educators, military personnel, planners, financial analysts--and much more--as they provide the services the American people require of their government; and

WHEREAS, public administrators, with other public employees, represent government in their day-to-day interactions with citizens; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Kansas deserve a high quality, professional, responsive public service today and in the future; and




WHEREAS, to maintain a high quality professional public service for future generations, the State must attract and retain talented people with the required skills who will use those skills in service to the people of Kansas:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Sam Brownback, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF KANSAS, do hereby recognize April 17-21, 2017, as
